*As of October 20, 2020, the Los Angeles County Public Health updated the El Segundo Confirmed Case count to 139. Los Angeles County Public Health began reporting cases of positive COVID-19 based on the zip code the patient listed in the medical records. This reporting started on March 22, 2020 and El Segundo has had 139 reported cases.

**The Centers for Disease Control recommends a 14-day quarantine once a patient tests positive. It has been determined that a majority of cases resolve within the 14-day period, however some patients remain symptomatic beyond the 14-day period. This reporting of active cases takes the more generalized approach all patients are encouraged to follow medical guidance.

***These are the calculated case rates and testing positivity numbers determined by the ES AHIMT from Los Angeles County Department of Public Health data, available at the time of calculation.

Significant Updates:

- As of 10/14/2020 [Revised Health Officer Order](#) with clarifications on private gathering sizes and requirements.
- As of 10/19/2020 Governor Newsom [announces](#) Scientific Safety Review Workgroup.
 - California physician scientists will review vaccine process for safety before it is distributed in California.
- Updated Reopening Protocols
 - As of 10/16/2020 [Reopening Protocol for In-Person Services in Libraries](#).
 - Updated to clarify that libraries may remain closed, choose to reopen with limited occupancy, or offer sidewalk service only at the discretion of the library operator. The guidance below is for libraries that choose to offer in-person services.
 - As of 10/18/2020 [Protocol for COVID-19 Exposure Management Plan in Early Care and Education Sites](#)
 - Sentence added on page 2 to clarify that if an exposure happened in an ECE site classroom or an ECE site cohort, the entire classroom or cohort is considered exposed and will require quarantine. Updated content on symptoms screening prior to entry or while at an ECE setting on page 2 (changes highlighted in yellow).
 - As of 10/18/2020 [Appendix T2: Protocol for COVID-19 Exposure Management Plan in K-12 Schools](#)
 - Sentence added in the section on Exposure Management for 1 COVID-19 Case at School to clarify that if the exposure happened in a school classroom or school cohort, the entire classroom or cohort is considered exposed and will require quarantine. Simplified language on symptoms screening in the section on Exposure Management Planning Prior to Identifying 1 COVID-19 Case at School (changes highlighted in yellow).

Updates:

- As of 10/16/2020 Governor Newsom [announces](#) Release of \$30.7 Million in a fifth round of Project Homekey awards.
 - The City of Los Angeles has been awarded nearly \$13.5 million to acquire 70 units as interim housing while being converted to permanent housing units by the end of 2021. This facility was recently constructed and has large rooms, making it very suitable for permanent housing.
- As of 10/15/2020, El Segundo biotech firm ImmunityBio headed by Dr. Patrick Soon-Shiong, receives approval from the Food and Drug Administration to begin preliminary testing of its COVID-19 vaccine candidate.

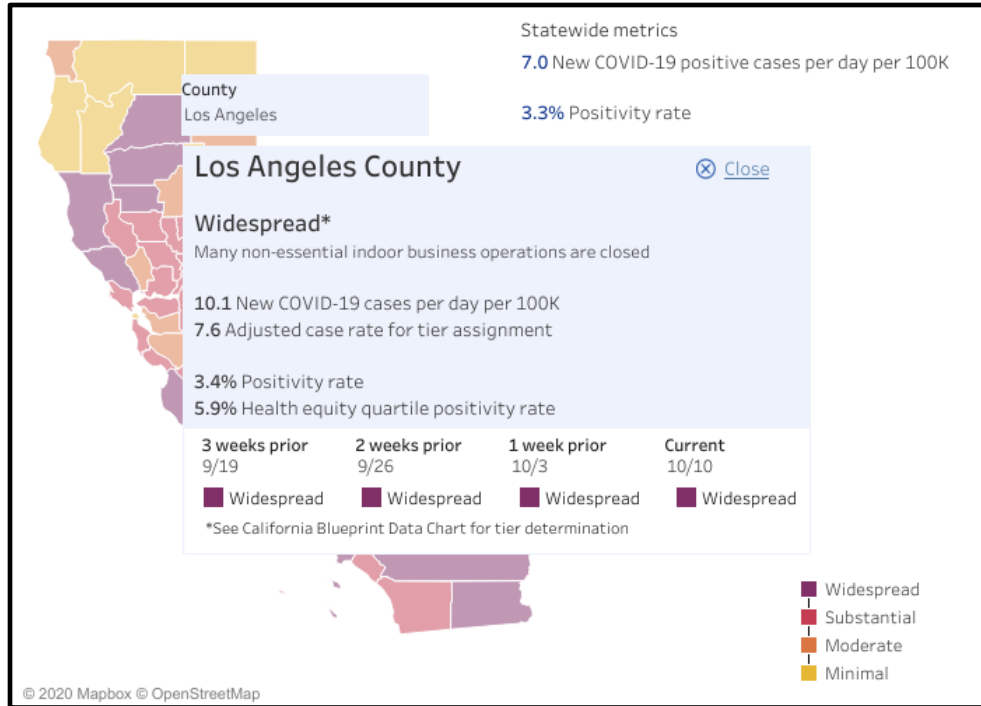
