

**Reopening Protocols for Youth and Adult Recreational Sports Comparison:**

<b>Previous Protocols: 10/22/2021</b>	<b>Current Protocols: 2/16/2021</b>
Adult Sports Leagues Closed (p. 1)	Adult Sports Leagues Open (following the same guidelines as youth sports) (p.1)
All sports must take place outdoors (p. 1)	Outdoor, low-contact sports may resume for all activities (p. 1)
Social distancing of at least six (6) feet must be maintained and eight (8) feet during periods of physical exertion	Social distancing of at least six (6) feet must be maintained and eight (8) feet during periods of physical exertion
Screening Protocols required before players and coaches may participate in youth sports activities (p. 2)	Screening protocols required before participants, coaches, and support staff may participate in youth and adult recreational sports activities (p. 4)
All youth sporting events, including tournaments, events or competitions are not permitted at this time (p. 2)	Inter-team competitions (defined as competitions between 2 teams only) are permitted for Outdoor, Low-Contact Sports ( <a href="#">listed in table 1 of the protocol</a> ) under certain conditions (p. 4). Any tournaments or events that involve more than 2 teams are not currently permitted (p.1)
-	Observers are permitted for youth sports (age 18 years and under) practices and competitions for age-appropriate supervision (p. 4). Observers are not permitted for adult recreational sports (p. 5).
Players may share equipment between two players as part of skill-building exercise. Sharing of this equipment should only be in designated pairs of players, not as a group activity. If equipment must be shared, it is disinfected between use by different people (p. 3)	Participants may share equipment between two participants as part of skill-building exercises or during game play. If equipment must be shared, participants should perform hand hygiene before play, during breaks, and at conclusion of activity. (p. 5)
Sports teams that have access to indoor bathroom and locker facilities may access them for the purposes of engaging in hand hygiene, changing, showering, and utilizing the rest rooms. Stagger visits to the locker room or rest rooms to allow for physical distancing while indoors (p. 3)	For recreational sports teams that have indoor facilities, including but not limited to bathrooms and locker rooms, employees, coaches, and support staff may continue to access the indoor areas of the facility to use the restroom or take breaks, to conduct essential office operations and to move supplies and materials in and out of the building each day. Participants and visitors waiting to use the indoor restroom must wait outside until the restroom is not occupied. The facility must monitor entry into the facility (p. 5).

-	Youth and Adult Recreational Sports operators, coaches, and participants for swimming and diving must also refer to the County’s <a href="#">Public Swimming Pool protocols</a> , which are specific to those Recreational Sports

**Protocols for Reopening of Public Swimming Pools:**

Previous Protocols: 12/7/2021	Current Protocols: 2/17/2021
Outdoor pools are allowed to be open for regulated lap swimming (one swimmer per lane [p. 4]) and drowning prevention classes only, including swim lessons with certified instructors (p. 1)	Outdoor pools are allowed to be open for routine use (provided that all employees and pool users maintain a physical distance of six (6) feet from non-household members and that employees and pool users wear a face mask when not in the pool), in addition to drowning prevention classes, including swim lessons with certified instructions, and aquatic therapy (hydrotherapy, pool therapy) sessions (p. 1).
Indoor pools are allowed to be open only for drowning prevention classes, including swim lessons with certified instructors (p. 1)	Indoor pools are allowed to be open only for drowning prevention classes, including swim lessons with certified instructors, including aquatic therapy (p. 1)
Stagger available lockers in locker rooms to maintain physical distancing, changing rooms and restrooms are monitored to ensure that the number of people inside at one time allows for proper physical distancing (p. 4)	Use of showers, changing rooms, and lockers is not permitted (p. 4)
Except for drowning prevention classes with certified instructors, other types of swimming lessons are discontinued (p. 4)	Private lessons or therapy sessions are allowed using proper physical distancing techniques. Group lessons are permitted provided that class size is limited to ensure a minimum of six (6) feet of physical distance between participants during all activities. Face masks must be worn at all times when they are not in the water (p. 5)
-	Inter-team competitions, defined as a competition between two teams only, are permitted in compliance with the LACDPH <a href="#">Protocol for Youth and Adult Recreational Sports</a> (p. 5).
